

Produce Market Report for 2021

The Mid-Ohio Food Collective & St. John's Lutheran Church have formed a partnership to distribute food to our local communities. Our first market was held on Tuesday, October 19, 2021 and will continue on the third Tuesday of each month in 2022.

119 different households have been served to date & 30 different volunteers have given of their time to help distribute the food. So far we have given away potatoes, sweet potatoes, carrots, celery, peppers, a mountain of cucumbers, corn on the cob, eggs, cantaloupe, pineapple, lettuce, cabbage, oranges, apples, & pears. That adds up to over 25,000 pounds of food!!! Any left-over food has gone to the Franklin Local School District, Eastside Community Ministry & the Salvation Army.

Our volunteers have done an AWESOME job of jumping right in & getting the job done. From registration, to bagging the food, to the safe distribution of the food & clean up. I commend them for a job well done each month.

The recipients of the market have been very appreciative of the food given to them. Some have even told me that they have shared some of the food with family, friends & neighbors.

The purpose of this market is to provide healthy & wholesome foods to anyone that needs or wants it out in our rural communities. No financial questions are asked.

Thanks to the organizing committee of Leslie & Gary Williams, Don & Lynn Parmiter, Janet Novaria & Jeff & Karen Showers. We have had a few bugs to work out, but the process has become smoother & more efficient as we go along. We welcome any suggestions.

Help us spread the word that the food will be available on the third Tuesday of every month from 10 am - 12 noon. Anyone is welcome.
