

"ACT OF NATURE" OR "ACT OF GOD"

These are essentially synonymous referring to events caused by natural forces beyond human control.

"ACT OF NATURE" is a event caused solely by natural forces without human interventions. Such as lightning, blizzards. earthquakes, flash floods, etc.

The difference- "ACT OF GOD" generally refers to an event involving a natural disaster. Acts of God are any natural incidents considered beyond an individual's control, difficult to predict, and hard to quantify in terms of damages that occur.

Following the horrible flash flooding in Texas over the fourth of July, we may have found ourselves asking was this an "Act of Nature or Act of God". No matter how we try to define this horrible event we all know that with it has come an extreme amount of human suffering.

During times of turmoil, God's people have reason to be confident. Hezekiah described God as "our refuge and strength" and "an ever-present help in trouble" (Psalm 46:1). God has the ability to protect His people in any circumstance, and His power is unlimited. God is not deterred by threats of war, natural disasters, violence, terriorism, or any catastrophe. Regardless of the situation, there is no need for us to fear, because God does not abandon His people in times of trouble

Storms come in a variety of shapes and sizes (not just natural disasters). In day-to -day life, some of the most common offenders are financial issues. medical problems, depression and anxiety, tension at work, addition, family disputes, and other problems that leave us feeling fearful and confused. In the gospel of Mark we read an account of Jesus and His disciples encountering a storm as they traveled by boat. The disciples were terrified and feared for their lives, but Jesus was sound asleep in the boat. When they woke up Jesus He rebuked the wind and calmed the storm By doing so, Jesus demonstrated His power over nature. Jesus is not only in control of nature; He is also sovereign over every troubling circumstance we encounter. Like the disciples, we too can approach Jesus for help. The author of Hebrews wrote, "Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need (4:16)
