Pastor Rebecca Grate is a gifted mission developer, but we always knew this innovation would be a BIG project, and it would be even better as a Synod project, with all of us supporting it and learning from it together. It is still in its formative early days, but MomenToUs has been exceeding all of our early goals and we are having to set new goals as fast as we can! MomenToUs is supported by a combination of Southern Ohio Synod Mission Support, Thrive! funds, ELCA grants, and also by generous grants and contributions from congregations who are excited to participate in a holy experiment that is sharing God's abundant love with new people.

We are so grateful for you and your good work here in the Southern Ohio Mission. You not only have abundant life in Christ, you share it – in your personal lives, in your congregational life, and in the world. Our work together would not be possible without your faithfulness. Your generosity has allowed other people to experience God's abundance in new and life-giving ways.

To continue our good work together, the Synod Stewardship Team asks your congregation to prayerfully consider a commitment of \$6,869.00 for 2024-25. The enclosed Statement of Intent will assist your Synod Council, Staff, and Teams as they make plans for the coming year. We really are stronger and better together, and we are so thankful to work alongside you as, together, we seek to share God's abundant life with everyone.


