Motion to Adjourn - 8:57 pm [T. Gibson/G. Williams] Meeting followed by The Lord's Prayer L. Showers - for Council Secretary, Frank Dietz I have been chosen to be a Volunteer Guardian for the June 13th Honor Flight.

Honor Flight is a National organization with a local base in Columbus Ohio.

According to their website "Honor Flight Columbus is a nonprofit organization dedicated to honoring America's veterans with a trip to Washington DC to visit their service and war memorials. These trips are free of charge to any qualified veteran. We strive to help veterans share their stories with future generations, as well as celebrate their service to our country with a proper homecoming that many of them never received. With the conclusion of the 2023 flight season, we have successfully flown 128 missions that totaled over 9,300 veterans. Our organization is funded entirely by donations from various businesses, foundations, school organizations, and other grateful Americans."

Each Guardian must go through training. Guardians and Veterans meet for the first time about two weeks prior to their trip as the Guardian is required to deliver the Veteran's shirt prior to the trip. Guardians must pay their own way or have sponsorship and the cost for each Veteran is covered by Honor Flight Sponsorships.

I follow Honor Flight Columbus on Facebook. Watching homecoming videos is amazing and for some Veterans it is described as the Homecoming they never had. You just stop, listen, and shed a few tears while watching.

Honor Flight invites all who want to attend- to the Homecoming at John Glen International Airport June 13 starting around 9 PM. The Homecoming usually takes about one hour. This is a great way to show your patriotic spirit and honor those who served. It is also a great history lesson for our children. I would love to see a few familiar faces when we land, not for me but for our Veterans.


I am so excited and honored to be part of Mission 133 sponsored by Dublin Honor Flight. I can't imagine the stories, the heroes and the emotions I will be part of.
