HOPE AND ANTICIPATION

Our lives are full of hope and anticipation. They give our day to day lives a purpose.

HOPE is defined as a feeling that what is wanted will happen.

St John's Lutheran Church Church Council Minutes February 6, 2025

Council vice president Robert Pletcher called the meeting to order at 7:01 P.M. Council members present were Nathan Atkins, Tom Gibson, Steve Wolfe, Bill Thomas, Frank Dietz, Joe Pletcher, and Pastor Al Laese.

Pastor Al Laese led devotions based on "fishing for people."

The minutes of the January 2025 council meeting were presented by council secretary Frank Dietz. They were approved on a motion from Nathan Atkins and Steve Wolfe.

Pastor's report for the month of January 2025: 4 Sunday morning worship services and Sunday school, 4 cluster meetings, church council meeting, church annual meeting, a hospital visit, a visit and a funeral for a Roseville member. June 6 and 7 will be the Southeastern Ohio Synod Assembly with bishop election. Robert Pletcher asked for and received council's permission to be St John's Stovertown synod assembly delegate. Pastor's report approved on a motion from Joe Pletcher and Tom Gibson.

The treasurer's report was presented and reviewed. After a brief discussion the report was approved on a motion from Nathan Atkins and Frank Dietz 5 to 1.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Property – A new Exmark rear discharge mower will be delivered to the mowing crew before the start of grass season. Selling of the used Exmark mower will be done by council members. Property committee chairman Nathan Atkins requested permission to replace the elevator maintenance room door. Council approved replacement on a motion from Frank Dietz and Steve Wolfe.

PRAYER Committee – \$500 was given directly to the family of Tonya Dicks, Cannellville explosion and fire victims. PRAYER committee members are in search of men's and women's coats for Eastside Community Ministry.

Education Committee – Attendance is holding strong even in the harsh January weather. There is plenty of room for more attendees, especially on Pancake days on the last Sunday of the month.

Produce Committee – The give-away was postponed to January 29 due to the sub-zero temperatures. 15 volunteers welcomed 8,613 lbs of product at 7:45 A.M. 99 households were served. Leftovers were donated to the Zanesville Senior Center.

Worship and Music Committee – The WELCA annual LOVE Meeting and potluck will be February 10 after Sunday morning worship service in the church basement. Ash Wednesday Service will be on March 5th. Easter will be celebrated on April 20, 2025.

OLD BUSINESS 7:45 P.M.

Steve Wolfe volunteered to be on the local Veteran's memorial planning committee. He will report to the council on the committee's activity.

NEW BUSINESS 7:52 P.M.

Nathan Atkins and Bill Thomas motioned that the monthly financial report show more church funds and more details of all funds. Council approved the motion. Robert Pletcher and Joe Pletcher will work with our treasurer Jessica Fabiny to include the details.

Responding to questions and directives from the January 26, 2025 congregational annual meeting, the church council expressed gratitude to Pastor Al Laese for agreeing to be the interim pastor for our church during our time of turmoil 13 years ago.
