With a husband who throws dirty clothes on the floor as if you were a maid? With the coworkers who schmoozes the boss? With the sister who won't take her turn cleaning for your elderly parents? We all could be **patient** if it weren't for people!

We have no problems being **patient** with those who don't irritate or inconvenience us. But God says everyone. Of course, this is not possible without God's Spirit as our helper. He enables us to control our natural (sinful) impulses and obey what God wants. In the verses following I Thessalonians 5:14, He tells us how to have **patience** with everyone' don't repay evil with evil; seek what is good; rejoice always; pray always; and give thanks in everything, for these things are God's will for us.

The word **patience** means "long-tempered" or "long-suffering." It is part of God's nature and He wants to develop it in us, too. But it takes **patience** to develop **patience**- it's a process. St John's Lutheran Church Church Council Minutes April 3, 2025

Council vice president Robert Pletcher called the meeting to order at 8:00 P.M. Council members present were Nathan Atkins, Tom Gibson, Linda Showers, Bill Thomas, Gary Williams, Steve Wolfe, Joe Pletcher, Frank Dietz, and Pastor Al Laese.

Linda Showers led devotions based on conviction versus condemnation.

The minutes of the March 2025 meeting were presented by council secretary Frank Dietz. After verifying that the new Veterans Memorial was not a motion, the minutes were approved on a motion from Gary Williams and Nathan Atkins.

Pastor's report for the month of March: attended the Southern Ohio Synod bishop's annual convocation March 17, attended funeral of Bishop Robert Kelley, 4 cluster meetings one of which was in Adamsville, church council meeting, 5 Sunday worship service and Sunday School, Ash Wednesday service, 4 adult Bible study, a private communion, 2 hospital visits, 2 other visits, and 530 miles submitted. Pastor Laese will be taking off May 4 to do a funeral in Pennsylvania. Pastor will find an ordained clergy member for the Sunday communion service. Pastor's report was approved on a motion from Frank Dietz and Tom Gibson.

COMMITTEE REPORTS 8:21 P,M,

Finance – The produce market fund will be added to the treasurer's report.

Property – suggestions and insight about a solution to the water ponding at the driveway entrance is requested.

Produce – 15 volunteers distributed 6,556 pounds of products. Even with the delivery truck being ½ hour late the distribution started at 9 and was over by 10:15. There was no leftovers. Leslie Williams, Linda Showers, and Karen Showers will attend a zoom meeting April 3 to learn the new computer system.

PRAYER – trying to find ways to assist a local resident who is struggling financially. Memorial – The committee can secure the funds, they just need a place to construct the monument. It will be the church's stone. Nighttime flag illumination is no longer a requirement. Approval process will need council approval and congregational approval.

Worship and Music – thanks to Joy Pletcher for musical assistance for the Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services.

NEW BUSINESS 9:02 P.M.

The graveyard superintendent informed council that more gravesites are needed. An 80 foot extension between the existing graveyard and the church parking lot has been marked out for inspection.

Frank Dietz and Bill Thomas motioned to adjourn at 9:10 P.M. All prayed The Lord's Prayer. Frank Dietz - council secretary

The women of the ELCA met at the church. Seven members were present. President Kathy Jenkins welcomed everyone and greeted them with "April showers bring May flowers." She thanked Leslie Williams for hosting the meeting and having the topic. We had a moment of silence for those affected by the recent flooding. After prayer we helped ourselves to Leslie's delicious cranberry salad and sugar cookies.

The secretary's report was not read.

Treasurer's report:

Checking - \$529,97

Savings - \$3913, 69

The next meeting will be June 10th at the church at 2PM. Karen Showers will be hostess and topic leader.

Treasurer Leslie asked us to be thinking of a local charity that we could donate the bucket money to.

- 10) be honest


