CHALLENGES.....

Everyday we face **challenges** in our lives related to work, relationships, health, finances, or even bereavement. No matter what **challenges** you're going through, there is always hope. Sometimes you experience **challenges** to stretch your character. If you don't go through any **challenges** or problems in life you will not grow. Steve Kinzey, Medium

But, we as Christians, know that God is always there to help us face these challenges.

Each of our lives is uniquely different. We need to start by modeling the kind of faith-based boldness that David exhibited during his encounter with Goliath (Samuel 17)

The youngest of Jess's sons, David spent many hours in the fields, taking care of his father's sheep. It was here that David prayed and meditated on God. This intimacy with the Lord allowed David's faith to grow. David knew that God would be with him in all situations.

When David left his father's fields to check on his brothers who were with King Saul's army it was not by chance that his visit coincided with the nine-foot-nine-inch tall warrior named Goliath. As David began talking to the soldiers, he encountered his first challenge in the form of his oldest brother, Eliab, who said "Why have you come down? And with whom have you left those few sheep in the wilderness. I know your insolence and the wickedness of your heart, for you have come down in order to see the battle (1 Samuel 17:28)

Now David could have taken this attack upon his character to heart. John Maxwell writes, "Many negative seeds are planted in our minds until we often stop short of what we can do for God, for others, and for ourselves." But because of his faith-based boldness, David was able to turn away and continue on his mission.

David's next confrontation was with King Saul. Saul tried to discourage the only one willing to face the giant and said "There is no way you can fight this Philistine and possibly win! You're only a boy, and he's been a man of war since youth (1 Samuel 17:33)

Saul was right. David had no battlefield experience.

But inexperience can be a good thing. Tim Elmore writes, "When we are inexperienced, we tend to lean on God for results. We recognize how little we possess-and how much we need His help". David relied on God to deliver him and he was not about to stop doing so now, "I've been a shepherd for my father. Whenever a lion or bear came and took a lamb.. GOD who delivered me from the teeth of the lion and the claws of the bear, will deliver me from this Philistine") Samuel 17:34

Goliath took one look at David and began to taunt him. Then David actually "hurried and ran toward the army to meet the Philistine" (1 Samuel 17:48

Because of his intimate knowledge of God, David was able to turn away from a maligner, defend himself before a discourager, and fell a giant with one smooth stone. By using his faithbased boldness, David met the challenges presented to him and, as a result routed the entire Philistine army. All for God's glory!

If we build up our confidence by spending time in the Word, prayer, and meditation, getting to know our God intimately, we can be like David, who with faith-based boldness, "rose early in the morning" (1 Samuel 17:20) to meet every challenge God put in his path.

Fearlessness Though an army may encamp against me, my heart shall not fear. Psalm 27:3

I remember the story of David, how he faced opposition from his brother, his king, and then a huge giant, all under the watchful eye of his enemies. Sometimes I get so scared my heart begins beating a mile a minute. And those are the times when I have taken my eyes off of You. Keep my focus on Your Word. Plant this verse in my heart so that when dread comes upon me, I can say these words and kiss fear goodbye.

Our Help.. Our help is in the name of the Lord, who made heaven and earth. Psalm 124:8

I need look no further than You, Lord, to help me. It is Your name that I trust. It is Your power that will help me meet this challenge. After all, You made me. You know the plan for my life. You have equipped me to do what You have called me to do. Help me not to rely on myself but on You and Your power. That is what is going to give me victory in this life. Thank You for hearing and answering my prayer.


WELCA NEWS.....

Mission Growth: Susan West will be putting together the Thankoffering service which will be held Sunday, Nov. 19. She will be looking for volunteers to participate in the service


Mission Community: No report
