KINDNESS MAKES RELATIONS GROW by Fruit of the Spirit, Maria Hornok


Let all bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor, and evil speaking be put away from you, with all malice. And be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God in Christ forgave you. Ephesians 4:31-32

"Be king to your wife" is how a pastor in Wisconsin closes his phone conversations to friends. Following his simple recommendation lends harmony to relationships. As a fellow pastor my husband includes Ephesians 4:32 in wedding ceremonies. Kindness is like plant food to all our relationships, whether with husband and relatives;

friends, and coworkers; or to checkers, servers, phone agents and salesclerks. Kind words and deeds minimize conflicts and nurture our bonds. By the same token, tenderheartedness waters our relationships. They dry up when we fail to be sensitive to each other's feelings or empathize with others.

Along with kindness and tenderness, we must also forgive offenses. This kills the noxious weeds of bitterness and malice. We forgive because God commends it, not because the offender deserves it. Do we dare hold a grudge against someone when God has forgiven all our offenses against Him? When we trust in Christ for eternal life, His blood cleanses us from all sin and provides open fellowship with God through Christ. Likewise, forgiving one another keeps our human relationships open and eliminates feelings of resentment.

Ephesians also says to put away anger and evil speaking. Ephesians 4:29 tells us how-our words should build up and give grace to those who hear. The fruit of the Spirit includes words of encouragement spoken graciously. Would you like your relationships to grow?

Linda Showers offered a devotion from Billy Graham on "Why Church": *The true Christian goes to church not for what he can get out of it, but for what he can put into it... When the church remains strong, it burns brightly as a beacon of hope and peace.*

Joe Pletcher read the minutes from the August meeting from The Word [Approved as read]
