

"FEAR NOT, FOR I AM WITH YOU;".....

-The God of Comfort, Bible Verses. Zondervan.

The most repeated phrase in the Bible is, "Do not fear". God knew His people would struggle with anxiety, and He repeatedly addressed the topic in the Scriptures. In Isaiah 41:10, God instructed His people not to fear because He was their God. Usually, when fear overwhelms us, it's because we are consumed by a situation that is beyond our control, and we are afraid of what might happen. But God instructs us to be mindful of His presence. The Bible promises that God will never leave us or forsake us. (Hebrews 13:5), and therefore we never face a problem alone. When we are aware of God's presence in every situation. we can shift our focus from our problem to God, who promises, "I will strengthen you, yes I will help you" (Isaiah 41:10). God's provision arrives at the exact time we need it. The situation causing us anxiety may be out of our control, but nothing is beyond God's control.

"Fear not, for I am with you; Be not dismayed, For I am your God. I will strengthen you, Yes I will help you I will uphold you with My righteous right hand."

Isaiah 41:10

Where God's love is. There is no fear, because God's perfect love drives out fear. It is punishment that makes A person fear, so love Is not made perfect in

the person who fears.

1 John 4:18

An encouraging word during a time of stress can be like water to a parched throat. The prophet Isaiah instructed his readers to be strong and not to fear. Isaiah offered hope with these words: "Your God will come." When we are waiting on a situation to change, we might begin to wonder of God will ever intervene. But Isaiah's words remind us that God is faithful. At times we will be forced to wait longer than we would like, but during those times God strengthens our faith and deepens our trust. God never promised us that life would be comfortable, so we shouldn't be surprised by trouble when it comes. But as we wait for God to act, we have the potential to grow closer to Him, to know Him better, and to love Him more. As our history developes with God, our faith grows and we become strong in the Lord.

Say to those who are
Fearful-hearted,
"Be strong, do not fear!
Behold, your God will
come with vengeance,
With the recompense of God'
He will come and
save you"
Isaiah 35:4

In the Scriptures, the term, fear sometimes refers to reverence, and other times it denotes "trembling or terror". Proverbs 29. The author was referring to the latter and communicated that being scared of other human beings is a snare for God's people. When believers are fearful of

another person, it's the individual will have a measure of control over us. But if we trust God, there is no reason to fear anyone or anything, because "whoever trust in the Lord is kept safe" (vs 25) The word safe used in this instance means "to be set inaccessibly high," meaning that God lifts us to a place of safety that is out of reach from human threats. Chronic fear of another person demonstrated a lack of faith that God will protect us, but God demonstrates time and again He is worthy of our trust.

Fear of man will prove to be a snare, but whoever trust in the Lord is kept safe.
