There were no applications for the Camp Scholarship Fund Process for youth who would benefit from a church camp scholarship. Council will begin process again early in 2026.


Steve Wolfe reported that the Veteran's Memorial Committee is looking at a possible location in Cannelville. Council will hold until further notice.
