FORGIVENESS

GOD'S IMMEASURABLE MERCY

(Back of weekly bulletin)

Forgive seventy-seven times? Jesus' instruction at best, all but impossible and, at worst, dangerous. Sometimes the Bible has been used to excuse abuse in the name of mercy, but Jesus doesn't mean to condone suffering for its own sake or to commit us to endlessly enduring hurt and harm. Instead, Jesus wants to orient us to the all-encompassing nature of forgiveness. Seven days make the week complete and whole. Grace also extends to us the promise of wholeness, and yet forgiveness that comes from the heart is immeasurable.

Forgive seventy-seven times. The number suggests that forgiveness isn't to be doled out or strictly accounted for, but rather is endless. Forgiveness is not a singular event as much as it is a process. We are amazed and rightly inspired when some Christians are able to so quickly forgive others even the most horrendous crimes, like the Amish community after the West Nickel Mines School shooting in 2006, or some families of the Emmanuel Nine in 2015. But today's gospel (Matthew 18:21-35) does not preclude the rest of us. Probably for most of us, forgiveness is much more the destination we are journeying toward than the place at which we've already arrived.

Every day God calls us back to the everlasting promises made in baptism. Our participation in the church's worship life assures us that forgiveness is not something we endeavor to do alone, but rather is a lifelong journey in which we can turn to one another for support. Every Sunday

at Jesus' table we are freely given the bread of mercy and cup of forgiveness. God's grace sets all of us free to extend that same mercy to others. God's forgiveness erases every debt.

Bear with each other and forgive one another. If any of you has a grievance against someone, Forgive as the Lord forgave you.

St John's Lutheran Church Congregational Council Minutes August 3, 2023

Bill Thomas opened the meeting at 7:58 P.M. Members present were Gary Williams, Joe Pletcher, Robert Pletcher, Frank Dietz, Steve Wolfe, Nathan Atkins, Jason Fabiny, and Pastor Al Laese.

Bill Thomas led devotions from Collosians 3, 1-4. Keep your minds fixed on Christ.

Council secretary Frank Dietz presented the minutes of the July Meeting. They were approved on a motion from Gary Williams and Joe Pletcher.

Pastor's report for the month of July 2023: 5 Sunday worship services and Sunday School, 4 weekly cluster meetings, July 15 family cluster gathering in Pleasant City, hospital visit, private communion, nursing home visit, 3 phone contacts, and 300 miles submitted. Jamie Ludwick has become the new pastor at Marietta as of August 1, 2023. Ordination was the last week of July. Pastor's report approved on a motion from Robert Pletcher and Gary Williams.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Produce Give-A-Way – The truck arrived at 8:45 A.M under sunny skies and temperature in the upper 70's. 97 households were required to fill out new paperwork. 16 new families were signed up. 568 fruit cups were given out through another Trivent application by Susan and Brian Miller. Leftover food was taken to the Salvation Army. Thank you to all the volunteers.

PRAYER CO committee – The canoe trip will be September 15, 16, 17, with a potluck on Saturday evening. Saturday October 7, 2023 will be the Triple Nickel Country Cruise-In. A \$250 gift card was given to the house fire victims in Cannelville.

Property committee – Karen Showers has asked that an embankment facing State Route 555 be utilized for the establishment of a "Memorial Daffodil Hill." There was a short discussion among council members concerning the advantages of such an area. A motion to approve such a project was made by Nathan Atkins. A second to the motion was made by Frank Dietz. The council approved the motion. Powerwashing, slate and gutter repair will need to have a 60 foot man-lift to complete these projects. The lift can be rented for approximately \$3000. Council decided to take this request to the church congregation because of the amount. It will be discussed with the congregation after worship service August 13, 2023. Options for the church parking lot followed. Resealing of the asphalt would be for looks only-it is not recommended.

Resurfacing with black top (\$\$\$) or chip-n-seal (\$\$) would repair the deterioration that is occurring. Repainting of the parking lot lines can be done at any time. Nathan Atkins motions to repaint the lines in 2023, obtain an estimate for the chip-n-seal of the parking lot, and to wait to resurface the parking till a later date. Frank Dietz seconded the motion. The council approved the motion. The elevator is still waiting for the inspector's approval.

The treasurer's report was presented and reviewed by council. It was approved on a motion from Frank Dietz and Gary Williams.

NEW BUSINESS

There will be a luncheon held September 10, 2023 to celebrate the new members to our church family.

Construction work occurring at St John's Lutheran Church in Zanesville is to repair the roof that was damaged during a hail storm in 2022.

Robert Pletcher will make sure that our church Workers Compensation coverage is adequate.

Steve Wolfe will replace the batteries and the patches for the church AED.

Frank Dietz and Nathan Atkins motioned to adjourn at 9:02 P.M.
